February Highlight Event - February 11th Peter Max Exhibit at the Nassau County Museum of Art and Lunch at Stresa Ristorante Italiano



If you have ever gone to an art auction on a cruise ship, then you will be familiar with the works of **Peter Max**. **Peter Max** is “one of the most widely recognized artists of our time” said art historian Charles A. Riley II, Ph.D. Join the Senior Activities Committee as we visit the galleries of the **Nassau County Museum of Art**, on **February 11, 2014**, to view an exhibit containing the first in-depth look at **Peter Max’s** original drawings. **Peter Max** revolutionized art of the 60s just as the Beatles transformed the music of that decade. From visionary pop artist, to master of dynamic neo-expressionism, **Peter Max** is an inextricable part of the fabric of contemporary American culture. This exhibition, the lauded Pop artist’s first museum exhibition in New York,

juxtaposes portfolios of his mostly black-and-white drawings on paper against many of his larger and more color-saturated works in a variety of media. The exhibition presents a broad array of one of the most recognizable and successful artistic careers of our times. **We will meet at 10:45AM at the Museum**. After our tour of the Museum we will all meet for lunch at **Stresa, Italian Restaurant**, located at **1524 Northern Boulevard, in Manhasset** The cost of the **Museum Tour and Lunch** will be **\$45 per person for residents** and **\$50 per person for non residents**. 
Book Club Activities

Backstage at the Metropolitan Opera - March 12th



Join the Senior Activities Committee for an exciting day on **Wednesday, March 12th** as we go behind the scenes for an exclusive look at what it takes to make operatic magic at the Metropolitan Opera! Tours offer a fascinating backstage look at one of the world's premiere performing arts organizations, including visits to the scenic and carpentry shops, rehearsal rooms, and stage area. If you like opera, (even if it's really not your cup of tea) the beauty of this opera house, the spectacular stage sets and costumes and superb acoustics are truly a sight to see and hear. Tours of the Metropolitan Opera increase your understanding of how the company works. Backstage tours visit production areas not usually seen by the general public.

Prior to our visit to the Met we will be stopping for lunch at The Dinosaur Bar-B-Que. Originally, the Dinosaur settled in 1988 in downtown Syracuse, N.Y., as a lunch/dinner bar-b-que joint. By 2012, the Dinosaur had expanded to six restaurants through out the Northeast. The Dinosaur Bar-B-Que is nationally acclaimed having been named the country's Number One BBQ on Good Morning America and has been featured on various Food Network and Travel Channel shows. Their food and sauces have won honors in publications such as Men's Health and Eating Well magazines. Their cookbook, [Dinosaur Bar-B-Que: An American Roadhouse](#), was voted as one of the best BBQ cookbooks by the National Association of BBQ. **The cost of this event is \$65 per person for Village residents and \$75 per person for non-residents and it includes: the bus, lunch at the Dinosaur BBQ, the Backstage at the Met tour, and all gratuities. The bus will leave at 10:00AM from the Village Hall.**


