The cost of the Barbeque, Show and Dessert is \$35 per person for residents and \$45 per person for non-residents. Space is very limited - Don't Miss Out.


Book Club Activities

Water Exercise Classes at the East Hills Pool

The Senior Activities Committee is sponsoring a series of Water Exercise Classes. Our instructor is a Certified Lifeguard. The series of exercises will focus on all muscle groups against the resistance of water for improved cardiovascular and toning benefits. You will enhance strength and flexibility while working on balance, calorie burning, and mobility along with the release of tension and the reduction of joint stress. This is a full body workout to relieve stiffness in muscles and an easy way to achieve health. Just bring a bathing suit and a towel.

The series will consist of two classes/week for seven (7) weeks. **Water Exercise classes are for adults only and will be held on Mondays and Wednesdays from 10AM – 10:45AM, starting on June 30th.** The cost of the entire series will be \$75 and does not include admission to the pool.

Queens Museum & Lunch - July 30th

Join us on **Wednesday, July 30th at 1PM** as we visit the **Queens Museum**, on the site of the 1939 & 1964 World's Fair. The crown Jewel of the Queens Museum is the **10,000 ft² Panorama of the City of New York**, a scale model of NYC built for the 1964 World's Fair by over 100 people over the course of 3 years. The Museum is also the home to **The Neustadt Collection of Tiffany Glass, Andy Warhol's 13 Most Wanted Men Collection** (from the 1964 World's fair), as well as the **World's Fair Visible Storage** exhibit (a collection of over 10,000 objects pertaining to the 1939 & 1964 World's Fair. After the



Museum visit we will be having a late Lunch at Pirandello in Roslyn. **The cost of the Museum and Lunch is \$25 per person for residents and \$30 per person for non-residents.**

Crocheting - "Back by Popular Demand"

Crochet is the process of creating fabric from yarn, thread, or other material strands using a crochet hook. If you are someone who has never crocheted before, or if it's been awhile, or you are ready to learn more, then these classes are for you. Whether you've always wanted to learn how or have just recently begun to yearn for the magical workings of hook and yarn, welcome! You've picked a great place to start. The class will teach the basics of crocheting and you will create a crocheted project every week. September Highlight Event - September 18th The Philadelphia Barnes Foundation



Join the Senior Activities Committee for what promises to be an amazing day, as we visit **The Barnes Foundation** in Philadelphia, on **Thursday, September 18th**. We have arranged for a private group docent tour of one of the world's leading collections of French Impressionist and Post-Impressionist paintings. It has been said, that a visit to the Barnes's unparalleled art collection leaves a lasting impression. That might be an understatement, as we will view the true draw of the Barnes Collection, which features 181 Renoirs, 69 Cézannes and 59 Matisses, along with works by Manet, Degas, Seurat, Prendergrast,

Titian and Picasso. Prior to our arrival at the Barnes Foundation we will stop at Philadelphia's historic public market, **The Reading Terminal Market**, the home of mouth-watering aromas, locally grown and exotic produce, Amish specialties, fresh meats, seafood, and poultry, handmade confections and baked goods straight from the oven. Here you will find everything you need to create a memorable meal, from cookbooks, to table linens, to kitchen ware, to fresh cut flowers, in addition to the widest variety of restaurants under one roof. During our stop you can have **lunch on your own** or just browse. On the return, we will stop in Cherry Hill, New Jersey for dinner at "**Famous Dave's**".

The bus will leave from the East Hills Park at 8AM promptly. The cost is \$90 per person for residents and \$105 per person for non-residents and includes bus transportation, the stop at the Reading Terminal Market, admission to the Barnes Foundation, a fully guided tour by a museum docent, and dinner at Famous Daves.
