Queens Museum & Dinner - July 30th

Join us on **Wednesday, July 30th** at the newly renovated **Queens Museum of Art** in Flushing Meadows Corona Park, near the Billy Jean King Tennis Stadium, on the site of the 1939 and 1964 World's Fairs. **Please be sure to arrive at the Museum between 12:00 Noon and 12:30PM.** Beginning at 1:00PM we will start a docent's tour of the Museum's current art exhibitions including **Andy Warhol's 13 Most Wanted Men**, plus the on-going displays from the World's Fairs of 1939 and 1964 - which include the **10,000 ft² Panorama of New York City**, the **Neustadt Collection of Tiffany Glass** and the **Watershed Model Relief Map of the New York City Water Supply System.**





At 4:00PM the group is scheduled to be in Roslyn for an early dinner at **Pirandello's Restaurant** (36 Lincoln Ave., Roslyn Heights) --- where Valet Parking is included. **The total price for the day is: \$25.00 for residents; \$30.00 for non-residents; and \$25.00 for dinner only.**



Winery Tour & Tasting with Lunch and Shopping Stop at Tangers - August 21st



Join the Senior Activities Committee on **Thursday, August 21st** for a tour of one of Long Island's premier wineries. We have arranged for a visit to the **Pellegrini Vineyards**, which makes some of the best wines on Long Island. The **Pellegrini Vineyards** are located in Cutchogue, the sunniest town in New York State, with climate and annual rainfall parallel to Bordeaux, France. Our tour includes visiting the vineyards, barrel cellar, and tank room with wine tastings both before and after the tour. After our visit to the vineyards we will be having lunch at the historic **Old Mill Inn**, overlooking the Mattituck inlet.

Following lunch we will make a shopping stop at the **Tangers Outlets** in Riverhead. **The bus will leave from the East Hills Park at 10AM promptly. The cost is \$65 per person for residents and \$85 per person for non-residents and includes bus transportation, the wine tasting and tour, lunch and the stop at Tangers Outlets.**

September Highlight Event - September 18th The Philadelphia Barnes Foundation



Join the Senior Activities Committee for what promises to be an amazing day, as we visit **The Barnes Foundation** in Philadelphia on **Thursday, September 18th**. We have arranged for a private group docent tour of one of the world's leading collections of French Impressionist and Post-Impressionist paintings. It has been said, that a visit to the Barnes's unparalleled art collection leaves a lasting impression. That might be an understatement, as we will view the true draw of the Barnes Collection, which features 181 Renoirs, 69 Cézannes and 59 Matisse's, along with works by Manet, Degas, Seurat, Prendergrast,

Titian and Picasso. Prior to our arrival at the Barnes Foundation we will stop at Philadelphia's historic public market, **The Reading Terminal Market**, the home of mouth-watering aromas, locally grown and exotic produce, Amish specialties, fresh meats, seafood, and poultry, handmade confections and baked goods straight from the oven. Here you will find everything you need to create a memorable meal, from cookbooks, to table linens, to kitchen ware, to fresh cut flowers, in addition to the widest variety of restaurants under one roof. During our stop you can have **lunch on your own** or just browse. On the return, we will stop in Cherry Hill, New Jersey for dinner at "**Famous Dave's**".

The bus will leave from the East Hills Park at 8AM promptly. The cost is \$90 per person for residents and \$105 per person for non-residents and includes bus transportation, the stop at the Reading Terminal Market, admission to the Barnes Foundation, a fully guided tour by a museum docent, and dinner at Famous Daves.

Technology Workshop - October 20th - November 23rd




