
## THE BARNES FOUNDATION - SEPTEMBER 18<sup>th</sup>



Be sure to join us for an amazing day in Philadelphia. We will be having lunch on our own at the famous **Reading Terminal Market**, home of a fabulous assortment of places to eat, browse and simply enjoy the atmosphere. Then on to the **Barnes Foundation**, where we will have a private docent tour of one of the world's leading collections of French Impressionist and Post-Impressionist paintings. Even if you have been there before, you won't want to miss this trip because of a **special exhibit: The World is an Apple: an extraordinary show of Cezanne's still-life paintings**,

including rarely seen, privately owned works from all over the globe, only on view at the Barnes until September 22nd. This exhibition highlights Cezanne's monumental achievement as a master and founder of the modern art movement. On our way home, we will stop for dinner at **Famous Dave's** in Cherry Hill, N.J.

**The bus will leave from the East Hills Park at 8 AM promptly. The cost is \$90 per person for residents and \$105 per person for non-residents and includes bus transportation, the stop at the Reading Terminal Market, admission to the Barnes Foundation, a fully guided tour by a museum docent, and dinner at Famous Dave's.**


## Brunch in the Park - *Frank Sinatra in Films* - October 26<sup>th</sup>

Our special guest speaker will be **Marc Courtade**, the Business Manager of the Tilles Center for the Performing Arts and featured speaker for the New York Council for the Humanities. Marc will provide us with an insider's view of **Frank Sinatra in Films**. *"Calling Frank Sinatra a singer and a film actor is a major understatement. 

## TOUR OF THE ELDRIDGE STREET SYNAGOGUE AND TENEMENT MUSEUM

### LUNCH AT KATZ'S DELICATESSEN

### THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 6th



Step back in time with SAC and join our trip to the Tenement Museum, the Eldridge Street Synagogue, and lunch at Katz's Deli. Experience the Lower East Side immigrant story and discover how they coped with economic depression by visiting the restored homes of immigrant families. Learn how they were able to balance work, family and religion during uncertain times. You will be escorted on a docent-led tour of the tenements. We will end the tour with a private discussion led by a museum facilitator about themes arising from our tour.



Then join us at Katz's Deli where we will have a sit down lunch in a private area. Return to your "roots" - have some cholesterol, and feast on Matzo ball soup, a half deli sandwich, French fries and soda. Mmmmm!



After lunch we will visit the Eldridge Street Synagogue to view the splendor of the restored sanctuary. Led by a docent, we will explore the rich history and memories of the hopes, opportunities and the obstacles faced by immigrants who settled on the Lower East Side. This breathtaking National Historic Landmark will enable you to experience the fascinating symbol of newly found religious freedom. View the 50 foot ceiling and the Moorish style interior of the magnificent building. As we tour you will feel the hopes and aspirations of all immigrant groups and understand their adjustments to a new place in time.

THE BUS WILL LEAVE FROM THE EAST HILL PARK AT 8:30 AM PROMPTLY. THE COST IS \$75 PER PERSON FOR RESIDENTS AND \$95 FOR NON-RESIDENTS. THIS COST INCLUDES BUS TRANSPORTATION, LUNCH AT KATZ'S, PRIVATE DOCENT TOURS AT BOTH MUSEUMS AND PRIVATE DISCUSSION AT THE TEMEMENT MUSEUM
