LAST CHANCE! Sign up for our SPECIAL TRIP TO HYDE PARK, VAL-KILL and LUNCH AT COPOLLA'S THURSDAY, OCTOBER 1st

Join us on a special trip along the Hudson River to the home of **Franklin D. Roosevelt** — the **Springwood Estate in Hyde Park**. This historic site is the birthplace, lifelong home and burial place of the 32nd President of the United States — the only 4 term president in American history. We will visit his home, library, museum, garden and grave — all open to the public. The estate remained the center of Roosevelt's life in all stages of his career. During his presidency he made over 200 visits here, the last one within two weeks of his death.



We will also tour **Stone Cottage at Val-Kill**, the place where Eleanor found peace and quiet and an escape from the hectic life at the mansion. After FDR's death, the First Lady lived here for 17 years, entertaining such heads of state as Winston Churchill, Nikita Khrushchev and Jawaharlal Nehru. During this time she also served as the country's ambassador to the United Nations and earned the nickname: "First Lady of the World." Val-Kill today is filled with many of her possessions, photographs and mementos of her travels.

As Faye worked less and less in films and enjoyed her family life with Phil Harris, Betty Grable became the studio's new star. Her famous pin-up pose during World War II adorned barracks all around the world, and she became the highest



paid star in Hollywood. Her film popularity continued until musicals declined in the 1950s, when she focused on the stage and night clubs. The films of both women are highly entertaining. In their own ways, each was a true star.

New Senior Activities Committee (SAC) Reservations Policy

Because of the amazing success of many of the Senior Activities Committee's trips and events, the SAC has adopted a new reservation policy to better serve the **residents of East Hills**.

For all SAC trips and activities that require a reservation, residents of the Village of East Hills will have a two (2) week window following their receipt of the Newsletter during which they will have priority in making a reservation. Reservations for non-residents that are received during this two week period will be held until the expiration of the 2 week preference period and will then be accepted, on a space available basis, in the order in which they were received. This includes reservations for guests of residents that were submitted with the resident's reservation.


followed by dessert.

The cost for the entire evening will be **\$20 for Residents / \$25 for non-Residents.**




